
In addition, we are soon going to have a paramedic called Mark Hayden working with us in the surgery. He will be able to see cases of "minor illness" and will also do home visits.

Appointments:

This topic comes up in most newsletters, but that is a sign of how important it is to all our patients. We do try very hard to offer a selection of appointments with the GPs- those which can be pre-booked, open-on-the-day appointments, telephone appointments (which may be routine or urgent) and of course home visits in appropriate circumstances. Other professionals also offer appointments (nurses, midwife, paramedic) and you will be asked the nature of your problem so that you can see or speak to the most appropriate person. We will very soon have an attached GP registrar (trainee) Dr Sutherland, who will also see patients but under supervision.

Remember you can sign up to make on-line appointments if this is easier than telephoning.

Get Online!

Don't forget that you can order repeat medications online as well as book doctors' appointments if you register for online access. To do this you need to present at reception with two proofs of ID, photographic proof (passport/driving licence) & proof of your address (utility bill valid within the last 3 months)

Prescriptions:

Just a reminder that all repeat medication ordering takes **3 working days** before collection. Please bear this is mind when you submit your order.

We now have a designated prescription area, with a prescription request forms along with a new red box (located by the pharmacy).

Travel appointments:

We are changing the way we manage our travel appointments in order to improve the service, There is now a short form for you to complete and return to us before booking your appointment. This will allow the nurse to check which vaccines you are likely to need prior to seeing you. The form is available from reception or you can print one off from our website and return by post. Please complete a form for each person who needs a travel appointment. Most vaccines need to be given at least 2 weeks before travel and some are given as a course over serval weeks or months, so its never to early to start. You can find lots of information on topics such as insect bite avoidance, travel insurance and food/water precautions at www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk which you may find helpful to look at before your appointment.

Childhood immunisations clinic:

Just a reminder that we run a walk in immunisations clinic for children, usually every Wednesday between 2 & 4.30pm. It is always worth ringing before coming in to double check the clinic is running.
