Krissie Bromly	Krissie has been in post since April 2018, offers appointments in Asthma, COPD, CHD, hypertension, cervical smears, ear irrigation as well as routine treatment room duties.	
Janet Herbert	Janet has been in post since August 2018. Janet is an experienced practice nurse, covering all treatment room duties including cervical smears, ear irrigation, travel and specialises in Diabetes.	
Olivia Archer	Olivia has been in post since May 2018. New to practice nursing however qualified in contraception/sexual health and able to fit and remove implants. Olivia is up and running with routine treatment room duties including smears and child immunisations. Olivia is also coming to the end of her Diabetes studies.

Appointments:

Yes there is always a section on appointments in the newsletter, and we are still trying our best to please most of the people most of the time! We have a mixture of pre-bookable and "open on the day" appointments for routine matters as well as emergency appointments for matters which cannot safely wait. As you may be aware low GP numbers in the UK are causing some concern although we are pretty lucky in this area. Please think carefully whether you need a doctors appointment or whether perhaps the Pharmacist can advise you. Other health professionals in the practice can often help as well/better than a doctor (nurses, our primary care practitioner midwife etc.) which is why you will be asked the nature of your problem when you phone.

Please contact the practice early in the day for a same-day appointment and especially if requesting a home visit.

Free Health Checks:

For free health checks you can contact <u>www.somersethealthchecks.co.uk</u>, to make an appointment and their findings will be sent through to us.

The Handi app:

These days there are useful health related websites and apps you may be interested in eg. The Handi app, which has been developed by Paediatricians at Musgrove Park Hospital to help parents access simple advice on children's illnesses.

SMS text messaging:

We have recently signed up to send SMS text messages to patients. This is for reminders of upcoming appointments and routine recalls like Asthma and Diabetes. If you would like to receive these, please let reception know so that they can opt you in and ensure your mobile number is up to date.

Repeat medications:

We have a great team on the prescriptions desk and the process runs very well. Prescriptions can be ordered online and you can nominate the pharmacy you wish to use. You can also ring the prescriptions line to re-order, or complete a form in reception. As always we require 3 working days to order your prescription and get it sent across to your nominated pharmacy.

Online booking:

We still offer online booking at the surgery, for patients to order their repeat medications and book routine doctors appointments. New patients will be signed up if they complete the form in their registration pack. If you have not yet signed up for this and would like to, please see a member of reception with two forms of ID (i.e. passport or driving licence and proof of address) and they will register you for this.

Patient Participation Group (PPG):

We have a patient participation group (PPG) at the practice. If you are interested in joining, please contact our Operations Assistant, Vivienne Postma, for further information. We are particularly keen to get representation from all ages and ethnic backgrounds. Even if you are not able to attend meetings, obtaining your views via other methods would be extremely useful to us. We are always looking for new members so please contact us if you would like to be involved.
